Message from the Pastor

In the Feasting on the Word devotional book, Patricia De Jong says it beautifully: "The coming of Advent jolts the church out of Ordinary Time with the invasive news that it's time to think about fresh possibilities for deliverance and human wholeness."

When was the last time you were "*jolted*" in church? We tend to prefer comfortable pews and familiar routines when we come to church, and yet sometimes a good jolt is exactly what we need! When Jesus was born in Bethlehem, his birth sent a shock wave throughout creation that is still being felt, and Advent is the perfect time to recognize the presence of those holy tremors!

Jesus the Messiah is all about shaking things up; all about transformation. When He came to Bethlehem 2,000 years ago, He transformed the perception of what a Messiah was all about. When He comes to us *today* in the person of the Holy Spirit, he transforms who we are and how we relate to one another and the world around us. And when He comes in the *future*, He will bring in the Kingdom of God in all its fullness, and thus transform all of creation.

Christianity is not a passive faith, and as we begin a new church year with the Season of Advent, I would invite you to *be jolted! Be jolted* out of your complacency and come to worship and Sunday School! *Be jolted* out of your secular focus, and focus instead on the living presence of Jesus Christ! *Be jolted* into a new awareness of the need we all have to pray! *Be jolted* out of old routines, and into an alertness of fresh possibilities for service and witness in your life!



The Apostle John had a vision of the final transformation; a transformation that will invade all creation and jolt us into a new and perfect reality. He records this vision in the 21st chapter of Revelation:

"And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "See, the home of God is among mortals. He will dwell with



ROOM IN THE INN HELPING THE HOMELESS FOR ELEVEN YEARS

Our church will participate in Jackson's ROOM IN THE INN program for the eleventh consecutive winter. This program, operated by Area Relief Ministries (ARM), provides food and shelter for the city's homeless men. We have agreed to provide this service on twelve separate dates during the upcoming winter season. Fifty Jackson churches assisted in the program last year, providing more than 3,000 beds and 6,000 meals. ROOM IN THE INN fulfills a need for a local homeless shelter that is not provided by any other agency.

We pick up the men from Area Relief Ministries at 5:30 PM using the church bus, and immediately bring them to the church Fellowship hall for a delicious meal. Adult Sunday school classes and our church youth volunteer to provide the evening meal and fellowship for the men. Following the meal, the men go to the gym where they will set up their cots; blankets, towels, and toiletries are provided. They may watch a movie, take a shower, play basketball, or simply go to sleep in a warm place. In the morning they are given a hot breakfast along with extra food items for lunch, and delivered back to ARM or their place of employment.

We need volunteers to help with preparing and serving the evening meal, cooking breakfast, staying overnight in the church gym, entertaining and socializing with the men, and cleaning up. Anyone wishing to provide food and/or assist with meal preparation should contact Mike & Lark Taylor (410-8312). All other volunteers should contact Ted Showalter (660-5348). Playschool News

If a story begins, "Once upon a time", it is an opportunity to teach our Playschool students that the story we are about to read is make believe, a fairy tale. It is a developmental milestone when a child comes to understand how to use their imagination and incorporate make believe into their world.

You may hear us use phrases like "critical thinking skills" and "creative problemsolving abilities" when explaining our curriculum. What we are really talking about

is... imagination. The way to foster the imagination is to provide children with opportunities to develop it for themselves when they are very young. These opportunities are found in one place and one place only... play. Playing with paints, playing with play dough, with costumes, with glue and with crayons. Making a mess. Splashing in a puddle. Wondering at a caterpillar you notice inching by you. Pretending to be a bird, gliding through the sky.

If children are spending hours sitting at a computer, watching television or playing video games, they are passive participants absorbing someone else's stories instead of having the time and space to dream up their own. If they are enrolled in soccer, ballet, T-ball, karate and gymnastics all in the same week, they are receiving wonderful opportunities to develop their skills. But they have little to no opportunity to use their creativity and imagination to decide how to use their free time, what fantasy to explore or what part of their world they'd like to discover more about at their own pace, in their own way.

If Playschool is really going to keep our promise to have each student ready for Kindergarten, then we must let children play! After all a some day a creative writing assignment will need imagination.


