Message from the Pastor

So now that our Discipleship Series is over, what impact should Christ have upon those who follow him? What should people see in us that is different from the rest of the world? Paul writes the Church in Corinth about that very thing in chapter 4:

This is how one should regard us, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God... For who sees anything different in you... I think that God has exhibited us apostles ... because we have become a spectacle to the world. We are fools for Christ's sake, but you are wise in Christ. We are weak, but you are strong. You are held in honor, but we in disrepute. To the present hour we hunger and thirst, we are ill -clad and buffeted and homeless, and we labor, working with our own hands. When reviled, we bless; when persecuted, we endure; when

slandered, we try to conciliate; we have become, and are now, as the refuse of the world, the off scouring of all things.

Leonard Cohen wrote that a saint is a person who has achieved a kind of balance amid the world's confusion. The energy needed to maintain that balance seems to derive from love – love for the world with all its uncertainties and hard realities. The saint does not change the world but rather moves freely in it, gloriously impervious to the forces that drag others down.

As followers of Christ, we are different – different because of love, for the sake of the world. We may be seen as foolish, because our attitudes are different from those attitudes so often exhibited in the world. We move freely in the world, but are not of the world. As believers, our goal



should be to enable the values of God's Kingdom to be seen in us.

So be different, for the sake of Christ, and watch Christ change the world one life at a time.
