Message from the Pastor

It was after the resurrection. A group of the disciples had gathered on the beach at dawn, and Jesus had cooked them breakfast. Following the meal, Jesus looked at Peter and said: "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" Peter, of course, responded vigorously: "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus then asked Peter the same question a second time, and then a third time: "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Each time Peter answered in a voice which must have carried a mixture of enthusiasm and frustration: "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you."

Why would Jesus ask the same question repeatedly? Well, if we think about it carefully, we can see that Peter struggles throughout his relationship with Jesus. One day he is The Rock, firm and unshakable, steady and unwavering in his commitment to Christ. The next day he is ON

the rocks, providing abundant evidence that he is, as Jesus said, a man of little faith.

Throughout his relationship with Jesus, Peter wobbles between faithfulness and betrayal, obedience and denial, mountain peaks and desert valleys. Sound familiar? How many times have you been proud of how far you have come as a Christian, and then, within a matter of days or hours, you commit a grievous sin which reminds you of how far you have to go? How many times have you felt that your faith was unshakable, only to have something happen which shakes you to your very

Like Peter, we constantly dance this dance of faithfulness and denial, walking in the certainty of God's Way one day, and floundering in the muck of our own way the next day. But the amazing grace of God is that,



despite our repeated failures, despite our faithlessness, despite our unbridled pursuit of worldly things, Jesus Christ is constant and faithful and passionate in His love for each of us. As often as we despise Him, He loves us.

As often as we turn away from the Father in anger, the Father turns toward us in love.

Playschool News

Over the last 10 years or so we Playschool teachers have found ourselves reviewing how we lead our students and what materials we offer in our classrooms. We have noticed shorter attention spans in our students and, during the times when children can choose their own activities, they most frequently choose to imitate characters they have seen on television or video. Our instincts suggested the changes we were seeing were

in significant part due to the exposure to screens from a very young age. Screens are everywhere: smartphones, tablets, computers, large televisions, and in our cars. We have come to accept and depend on their presence in our lives.

I wanted to know if our best guess for the behavior changes had any scientific support, so I started to read. Indeed, studies going back to the arrival of televisions in American homes have found a correlation between screen time and behavior changes. The intervening years have also seen an enormous shift in parenting styles. Together these changes have shifted how we raise our children and what parents expect from their children's schools. I have found the following two books very interesting and affirming to our mission at Playschool and I am happy to recommend them to you: *Achtung, Baby: An American Mom on the German Art of Raising Self-Reliant Children* by Sara Zaske and *Be the Parent, Please: Stop Banning Seesaws and Start Banning Snapchat* by Naomi Schaefer Riley. I found these helped me consider and re-consider what I assumed, and were a great conversation starter with my spouse, friends, family and co-workers. Both are available at the public library.



Session Highlights

The Session of First Presbyterian Church met on April 8, 2018 at 5:00 PM and conducted its regularly scheduled business. The Session:

- was reminded of the Presbytery Pentecost Event to be held at Rhodes College on May 20, 2018;
- was advised that work has begun on choosing people to serve on the Officer Nominating Committee for 2018/19 and that a Congregational meeting to elect the committee will be scheduled at the next Session meeting;
- voted to round up the One Great Hour of Sharing offering to \$2,000, with money to go to Puerto Rico relief—extra funds to come from undesignated benevolences;
- voted to plant a tree during Earth Day celebration at cost of \$250, and a scripture plaque, with money to come from undesignated benevolences;
- voted to install a donation box specifically for the Arboretum for the Earth Day celebration on April 21, 2018;
- voted to approve the 2017 internal audit done by Cowart, Reese and Sergeant for both the church and playschool;
- received info from Budget & Finance Committee that there will be two
 counters of money for the collection on Sunday; and that the church will no longer
 reimburse taxes paid on items purchased for the church, but that tax exempt forms
 will be provided to retailers at point of sale;
- was informed that Andy Combs of First Presbyterian Church Brownsville, will lead our domestic mission trip for 2018;
- voted to approve Cynthia Jones as an Affiliate Member of FPC, Jackson;
- voted to hold next meeting on Sunday, May 6, at 3 PM, due to Mother's Day;
- was provided information about the Presbytery Listening Sessions in the process of calling a new Executive Presbyter, with next sessions on April 15, 22 and 29.
