# Message from the Pastor

A number of years ago I stood on the shore of the Sea of Galilee trying to get up the nerve to step into it. I knew it was cold. I mean, even Jesus had enough sense to walk on top of that chilly lake! Eventually my desire to step into the sea where Jesus and Peter had bathed and fished overcame my fear, and I stepped into the sea. It was frigid, as expected, but it was also clear and full of little fish.

A few days later I stood on the shore of the Dead Sea, which is the lowest dry land on earth. In contrast to the Sea of Galilee, its water was quite warm, but it was also so salty the water itself felt slimy. Nothing appeared to be alive in it.

In his book <u>The Very Next</u> <u>Thing</u>, the lead singer for Casting Crowns, Mark Hall, points out that the Sea of Galilee and the Dead Sea are only a few miles apart from each other, but while the Sea of Galilee is fresh, vibrant, and full of marine life, almost nothing can

live in the dense saltiness of the Dead Sea. This is because, while the Sea of Galilee has outlets, nothing flows out of the Dead Sea. He goes on to say "One of the surest ways to become your own Dead Sea is to refuse to be a conduit through which Jesus' living water can flow... you're not a pond, you're a river. Everything that God pours into you is for you to pour into somebody else."

We must grow in our relationship with Christ so that we might be filled with the Holy Spirit, and the nature of Christ might be evidenced in us and flow through us to others. This must be the final goal of every aspect of life and of ministry.

Please come to worship on Sunday mornings, and bring a friend. Here you will find that your life is filled in so many ways, and because of that, you will be a blessing to others.





#### The Gospel According to Paul by John MacArthur

(Book Study) The apostle Paul penned a number of very pithy, focused passages in his letters to the early church that summarizes the gospel message in a few well-chosen words. Each of these key texts has a unique emphasis highlighting some aspect of the good news. John MacArthur closely examines the texts of Paul's letters to the early church, one verse at a time. The Gospel According to Paul, answers questions about the essential elements of the gospel message, how Christians can be sure they are presenting the gospel correctly, and how the Good News can be proclaimed to the world.



#### **Making Space- Exploring What Matters Most**



(DVD/Workbook) Do you know what's most important in life? Do you feel too busy to make time for those things? This study gleans wisdom from the Book of Proverbs and from the example of Jesus to show you how to center your life on God's priorities. You will examine the things that matter most to God and to you as a follower of Christ. Then you will learn to apply Godly wisdom that will help you incorporate these activities into your busy life. In some cases, you will find that you are doing the wrong things. Or you might find that you are doing the right things for the wrong reason or in the wrong way, so that they are not life-giving or fulfilling. Each week's session will function as a stand-alone message, providing great opportunities to invite friends and engage in conversations about a given topic.



#### The Book of Acts

(Bible Study) This is a line by line study of the Book of Acts. The life of the early church is recorded and preserved for us in the book of Acts. Acts is the only biblical book that chronicles the history of the church immediately after Jesus's ascension. As such, it provides us with a valuable account of how the church was able to grow and spread out from Jerusalem into the rest of the Roman Empire. In only three decades, a small group of frightened believers in Jerusalem transformed into an empire-wide movement of people who had committed their lives to Jesus Christ, ending on a high note with Paul on the verge of taking the gospel to the highest government official in the land—the Emperor of Rome.



#### The Same Kind of Different as Me

(Book Study/Movie) "Same Kind of Different As Me" is a New York Times best-seller and non-fiction account of two men from very different worlds. A dangerous, homeless drifter who grew up picking cotton in virtual slavery. An upscale art dealer accustomed to the world of Armani and Chanel. A gutsy woman with a stubborn dream. A story so incredible no novelist would dare dream it. Join us for a gripping true story of modern Christianity and a modern film based on this incredible story of people from opposite worlds who found life-long friendship in the fellowship of Christ.


