Suddenly, one took a small hand drill out of his pocket and began to drill a hole in the floor of the boat! His friend was flabbergasted!

"ARE YOU CRAZY" he asked? YOU'LL MAKE A HOLE IN THE BOTTOM OF THE BOAT, AND WATER WILL FLOOD IN, THE BOAT WILL SINK, AND WE'LL DROWN!"

"Calm down," the driller replied. "It's not your problem-I'm only drilling the hole under MY seat!"

What that poor driller forgot, I hope we will remember:

All of us are connected within the Body of Christ.

In Romans 12, Paul puts it this way:

"For as in one body we have many members, and all the members do not have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another."

As surely as the parts of a body are connected to one another, so also we are connected to one another. Thus, when one of us hurts, we all hurt; when one of us rejoices, we should all rejoice.

That's just part of what it means to be a caring Christian.

The ties that bind us to one another also apply to stewardship. We are individually called to faithful stewardship within the church, and yet it takes all of us, collectively, to effectively execute the mission to which Christ has called us. We are better together than apart, and we can do more communally than we can individually.



Our part of the Body of Christ has many membersso pray for one another, care about one another, and work to build one another up, so that the Body of Christ might be strengthened.

And remember: others in the Body are praying for you too!



Playschool News





When parents call to inquire about possibly enrolling their child in Playschool they have a list of questions. What is our schedule, what will their children learn, who are the teachers, and often many more. Choosing your child's first school may be one of the first big decisions parents make for their child. Each family's focus can be a little different—some really want to know their child will be challenged and learning; some want their child to have the opportunity to make friends; others want a safe, loving place for their child to be away from home for the first time. It has been hard to concisely convey the magic we have here at Playschool. More recently I have been describing what Playschool does as "offering our students a curriculum wrapped in love".

After the first days of school this year our students made me believe that "curriculum wrapped in love" was the most fitting description for Playschool. On the second day of school a family new to Playschool shared with us that their daughter was saying her prayers after the first day and said, "thank you God for my teachers because they love me." A few days later I met another new student while running errands. Seeing her teacher she exclaimed for all to hear, "that's my teacher from my new school!!!" while running into my arms for a hug. The expression on her mother's face was pure happiness at witnessing the joy in her child. When a child feels loved and valued for exactly who they are, they can soar. They want to learn and discover their love of learning.


