Message from the Pastor

In the <u>Feasting on the Word</u> devotional book, Patricia De Jong says it beautifully: "The coming of Advent jolts the church out of Ordinary Time with the invasive news that it's time to think about fresh possibilities for deliverance and human wholeness."

When was the last time you were "jolted" in church? We tend to prefer comfortable pews and familiar routines when we come to church, and yet sometimes a good jolt is exactly what we need! When Jesus was born in Bethlehem, his birth sent a shock wave throughout creation that is still being felt, and Advent is the perfect time to recognize the presence of those holy tremors!

Jesus the Messiah is all about shaking things up; all about transformation. When He came to Bethlehem 2,000 years ago, He transformed the perception of what a Messiah was all about. When He comes to us today in the person of the Holy Spirit, he

transforms who we are and how we relate to one another and the world around us. And when He comes in the *future*, He will bring in the Kingdom of God in all its fullness, and thus transform all of creation.

Christianity is not a passive faith, and as we begin a new church year with the Season of Advent, I would invite you to be jolted! Be jolted out of your complacency and come to worship and Sunday School! Be *jolted* out of your secular focus, and focus instead on the living presence of Jesus Christ! Be jolted into a new awareness of the need we all have to pray! Be jolted out of old routines, and into an alertness of fresh possibilities for service and witness in your life!

The Apostle John had a vision of the final transformation; a transformation that will invade all creation and jolt us into a new and perfect reality. He



records this vision in the 21st chapter of Revelation:

"And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "See, the home of God is among mortals. He will dwell with them; they will be his peoples, and God himself will be with them; he will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; mourning and crying

2019 Stewardship Update

Your Stewardship Committee brings this summary report of the 2019 Stewardship effort, to date, to you for your prayerful consideration.

First, sincere and heartfelt thanks to those members of our congregation who have cheerfully returned their pledge cards with generous giving commitments to support the 2019 ministry plans of our church.

Three goals for 2019 Stewardship were previously announced through a Minute for Mission and in the Sunday bulletin:

- A goal of 100% participation from the congregation in the 2019 Stewardship program
- For continuing pledgers to increase their level of giving year over year
- To reduce the need to supplement the 2019 operating budget with unpledged giving and interest income {begin to close the gap}

As of this week, here are the very encouraging results, in round numbers:

- 180 potential pledge units 89 pledges to date (112 pledges last year)
- Average pledge for 2019 \$6,500 (Average pledge last year \$5,500)
- 2018 challenge budget \$860,000 2018 pledges received \$617,000 (\$243,000 gap to fill with unplanned giving and interest income)

2019 challenge budget \$893,000 - 2019 pledge goal \$700,000 (\$193,000 gap to fill with unplanned giving and interest income)

2019 pledges received to date \$579,000

Practice Stewardship Today

(Remaining pledged amount needed to meet \$700,000 goal for 2019 is \$121,000)

We can do this – and more! As a congregation, working together as a team, we can share even greater financial resources for our church programs, and for those in need in our community and world. God has richly blessed each of us and we should offer our thanks for the many ways our faith positively impacts our lives by generously giving back.

If the 23 outstanding pledges from last year still come in for next year, at the average pledge amount, we will receive an additional \$149,500 of giving to fulfill our commitments to a growing church.

If we also increase the total pledges for 2019, above the 112 from last year, we will exceed our goal by an even greater amount, all to be used to support the many ministries of our growing church.

Every pledge, of any amount, is much appreciated. If you have pledged in the past and have not yet done so for 2019, we encourage you to make that commitment again. If you have not pledged in the past, please start with a 2019 pledge of any size to begin your journey of faithful giving. Together, as a congregation of faithful givers, we will help many in

WHEN MAKING PURCHASES FOR THE CHURCH:

Since FPC has a tax-exempt status, and we have a sales tax exemption number, all persons making purchases for the church should use the tax form and number when making purchases.

As part of our latest audit report, we are not to reimburse anyone for sales tax as part of a receipt/ request for payment. You may get a Tax Exempt form upon request from Vicki Pope to use when buying items for the church, which should be provided to the retailer at point of sale.

The church will no longer reimburse for sales tax paid.



YEAR END CONTRIBUTIONS

The general rule is that a contribution is effective when delivered. This means that a check deposited in the collection plate in January 2019 cannot be deducted in 2018, even if it is back-dated to 2018.

ONE EXCEPTION: checks that are mailed and postmarked in 2018 are deductible for 2018 even if the church does not receive them until 2019. Please plan your contributions accordingly.
