Message from the Pastor

C.S. Lewis wrote that: "The moment you wake up each morning, all your wishes and hopes for the day rush at you like wild animals. And the first job each morning consists in shoving it all back; in listening to that other voice, taking that other point of view, letting that other, larger, stronger, quieter life come flowing in."

So how do we do this? How do we nurture a personal relationship and come to know God? Five things are helpful. First of all, we must pray regularly. You cannot come to know someone whom you do not visit. We must regularly open ourselves to God in prayer.

Second, we must learn how to listen to God. Have you ever been in a relationship with someone who couldn't seem to stop talking long enough to listen? It doesn't work. God will probably not speak to you audibly, but if you share your

heart with God and then spend some time in silence, listening for a reply, you will begin to understand the strength and the love and the direction and the will of the great "I AM" who created you.

Third, we must read and study God's Word, for the **person** of God is revealed through the **word** of God. We come to know God as we perceive how God has come to know God's People through the ages. We love because God first loved us. The Bible is the story of how God consistently loves, guides, and interacts with God's People.

Fourth, it is important for us to at least sometimes go to God in prayer without an agenda. Without a demand, without a request, without a wish list – with nothing but an open mind and heart, and a willingness to encounter God *on God's terms*.



And fifth, as you build a personal relationship with God, share your experience with others – this is a personal relationship, but it is not a solitary relationship. We are all part of the body of Christ, and we grow together and stronger when we are in relationship with one another.

During this Lenten Season, may you intentionally seek to nurture your personal relationship with God.

"The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom I am the foremost. But for that very reason I received mercy, so that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display the utmost patience, making me an example to those who would come to believe in him for eternal life."

Session Highlights


