

Message from the Pastor

What is commitment? In his book <u>How To Spell</u> "<u>Presbyterian</u>", Jim Angell has this to say about commitment:

<u>COMMITMENT</u> is both a leap and a rescue. It is God's act of invading love represented by the coming of Jesus Christ into human life, and it is our response of discipleship. It is the opposite of indifference. It is the opposite of death.

<u>COMMITMENT</u> is the opposite of greed and anxiety. It is the opposite of "letting George do it".

COMMITMENT is the Spirit of God inviting us to change the message of resurrection from an Easter sermon into the 365-day-a-year stuff of life. It is a giving of oneself to honesty of life.

<u>COMMITMENT</u> is life's most important "yes" - our saying "yes" to a God who has said "YES" to us in Jesus.

It is walking together along a

road that doesn't end.
It is suffering together,
celebrating, reinforcing one
another's impossible dream.
It is checking out our understanding of God's will togetherdeciding how we can be
obedient and magnificently
obsessed during these days of
our own years.

<u>COMMITMENT</u> is loving ... and allowing ourselves to be loved. It is being merciful and granting mercy - even to ourselves. It is promises to keep, and promises that keep us.

COMMITMENT is knowing from the top of our heads down to our shoes that "private" Christianity is an incongruity; it is believing that we are constantly meeting Christ in one another, and being blessed and identified as children of worth through such meetings.

So...Is it worth being committed to Jesus Christ through the work of First Presbyterian Church?



Yes. Without question. It is imperative that we commit to something positive beyond ourselves, or else we will have no roots, no passion, no grounding in anything absolute. A life with no commitments is a life without purpose.

How important it is to teach our children that there are things to which we may be committed in this world! Things of worth and value that can be trusted, loved, and supported in conjunction with other Christians. So let's claim Christ, even as we have been claimed by Christ!

The Session of First Presbyterian Church of Jackson, Tennessee, met on Sunday, August 11, 2019 at 4:30 PM and conducted its normal business.

The Session voted:

- that the minutes from the Stated Meeting of June 9, 2019 and the minutes of the Called Session meeting of June 23, 2019 be approved as read;
- to approve the report of the commissioners to the Stated Meeting of the Presbytery of the Mid South;
- to unanimously electronically approve Rev. White to perform a wedding service for Nathan Ahn and Sharon Junn on July 28, 2019 immediately after worship;
- to unanimously by email raise the cost of Wednesday night dinners by \$1;
 Adults \$7; Children \$5 with a family cap of \$20 including a \$1 upcharge for take out meals:
- that First Presbyterian Church host Presbytery of the Mid South meeting August 13, 2020;
- to remove Bill and Margaret Sipes from the rolls of First Presbyterian Church as they have joined Community Presbyterian Church, Celebration, Florida;
- to table the request of Randilee Fields and Patrick Hewitt to have their wedding at FPC on May 16, 2020 (both members of FPC (EPC) Humboldt, TN in order for the Session to approve the officiant;
- to set a Congregational meeting for September 29, 2019 for the purpose of the election of new elders and church officers;
- to receive the annual Peacemaking Offering on World Communion Sunday, October 6, 2019 with 75% of the offering going to the Presbytery and 25% going to Arise to Read Jackson.
