The Synagogue School (Storytelling): Children will hear the story told using felt figures. **Focus:** Courage to face our fears, do what is right, God with us!





On this date congregations around the globe will celebrate World Communion Sunday. Observed by several Christian denominations, it takes place on the first Sunday of every October, promoting Christian unity and ecumenical cooperation.

PEACE AND GLOBAL WITNESS OFFERING: Sunday, October 6 on World Communion Sunday, we will receive the Peace and Global Witness Offering. Our Session has designated the 25% that this congregation retains to go to *ARISE2Read.*

ARISE2Read is Jackson's church/school partnership program. A-R-I-S-E, an acronym for *A Renewal In Student Education, was developed* in Memphis out of concern for failing schools and growing poverty.

ARISE2Read Jackson Madison County seeks to provide love and support to our public schools and to facilitate a literacy initiative called *Team Read*. ARISE recruits volunteers for Team Read to help second-graders memorize sight words, which helps improve their reading skills, their education, and future.
