DURING THE SEASON OF

Lent, we often think about giving up something. That's an interesting tradition, but what if, this year, we think about taking on something instead of giving up something?

One of the things we all take on when we become a part of a church family is the responsibility of faithful membership. What does it mean to be a faithful member?

Our Book of Order has this to say (G-1.0304):

"Membership in the Church of Jesus Christ is a joy and a privilege. It is also a commitment to participate in Christ's mission. A faithful member bears witness to God's love and grace and promises to be involved responsibly in the ministry of Christ's Church.

Such involvement includes:

Proclaiming the good news in word and deed

Taking part in the common life and worship of a congregation

Lifting one another up in

prayer, mutual concern, and active support

Studying Scripture and the issues of Christian faith and life,

Supporting the ministry of the church through the giving of money, time, and talents,

Demonstrating a new quality of life within and through the church

Responding to God's activity in the world through service to others

Living responsibly in the personal, family, vocational, political, cultural, and social relationships of life

Working in the world for peace, justice, freedom, and human fulfillment

Participating in the governing responsibilities of the church, and reviewing and evaluating regularly the integrity of one's membership, and considering ways in

which one's participation in the worship and service of the church may be increased and made more meaningful'

These are good guidelines for active church participation, and of course we need to remember that they all fall under the admonition of Christ to "love the Lord your God with all your heart and soul and mind and strength, and love your neighbor as you love yourself." This Lent you may choose to give up something, but let us also take on the responsibility of living faithfully and lovingly together, within the Body of Christ.



We will examine how we can receive important lessons from the ordinary things we encounter in everyday life.






Wednesday Nights at FPC Spring 2020

Every miracle, teaching, and action of Jesus in John's Gospel has a clear purpose: to prove he is Christ, the Messiah, and the Son of God.

The Great Divorce by C.S. Lewis (book study) is a classic Christian allegorical tale about a bus ride from hell to heaven. An extraordinary meditation upon good and evil, grace and judgment, Lewis's revolutionary idea in the The Great Divorce is that the gates of Hell are locked from the inside. Using his extraordinary descriptive powers, Lewis' The Great Divorce will change the way we think about good and evil.





The Prodigal God: Recovering the Hearth of the Christian Faith by Timothy Keller uncovers an unexpected message in the familiar—and often misunderstood—New Testament parable of the prodigal son by using Keller's characteristic intellectual approach to faith issues. Seekers and believers alike will see Christianity in a whole new way when they learn how Christ's followers are supposed to love, so they can join him in heaven.

Please pick up a devotional guide for this Lenten season. There are two guides available: *Treasure in Jars* of Clay and Finding Peace in Lent.



THE BLESSINGS OF PLAYSCHOOL

Play is one of the main ways in which children learn and develop. It helps to build self worth by giving a child a sense of their own abilities and to feel good about themselves. Because it's fun, children often become very absorbed in what they are doing.

Play is very important to a child's development, it is an integral part of a child's Early Years Foundation Stage and supports their learning journey too. Young children can develop many skills through the power of play. They may develop their language skills, emotions, creativity and social skills. Play helps to nurture imagination and give a child a sense of adventure.



Through this, they can learn essential skills such as problem solving, working with others, sharing and much more. In turn, this helps them develop the ability to concentrate.

It's important that learning is fun at this age. It needs to be about doing things with them that they like. Children learn through all their senses through taste, touch, vision, hearing and smelling. They will watch those around them and copy language and behavior.*

This information about play doesn't come directly from Playschool, although it is exactly why we stay true to our founding mission and purpose.

Playschool may sound like and old-fashioned or quaint name from a different time; however it is exactly how children are wired to learn and therefore how they learn best. Playschool is purposeful about the environment so that the opportunity to learn through play is available in every aspect of our classrooms.
