from the pastor

DOES ANYONE

remember the tremendously significant event that is recounted in the 9th chapter of Acts? (If you do, treat yourself to a nice piece of dark chocolate!).

That is the chapter where we read of the conversion of Saul. who later became known as Paul. Up until that point in his life, Saul had been feared far and wide as a persecutor of Christians – in fact, that chapter begins with the words, "Saul was still breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord." (Acts 9:1). But then Saul has a remarkable encounter with Christ, and becomes a completely different person. He goes on from that point to help establish numerous churches, and the letters he composes to those churches make up most of what we know as the New Testament.

In the person of Saul, God took perhaps the most unlikely of characters and transformed him into perhaps the most famous Christian the world has ever known. And the process of Saul's transformation was not initiated or accomplished by Saul – it was all God's doing! When God sets about the business of transformation, watch out!

As we learn about a new and safe way of living during a pandemic, we must remember that nothing is beyond God's ability to accomplish! During the next few weeks and months, as we look at how things have changed, and the needs and goals of our church, we are bound to find some things that need transformation. Some of those things may appear to be daunting, but again, nothing is beyond the ability of God to accomplish. God, in fact, seems to delight in transforming seemingly un-transformational people and circumstances!

God was not surprised or confounded by this pandemic. God is not wringing his hands over the fate of humanity, nor is God concerned about losing a single sheep that belongs to God's flock. The world may be



in turmoil, but all is well with God and God's flock. From Ps. 46:

"God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble.
Therefore we will not fear, though the earth give way and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam and the mountains quake with their surging...
The Lord Almighty is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress."

What a joy it is to serve such a powerful and loving God!





WE ARE STILL HERE FOR YOU


We wanted to remind everyone that while our services and programs will not be held in person until further notice, we are providing other ways to connect:

- 1. We will continue to hold *online worship* services every Sunday morning at 9:30 a.m.
- We continue to share online devotionals via email, Facebook, and our website and app each Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday between 1:00 p.m. and 3:00 p.m.
- We are hosting an *online Bible study* each Wednesday at 6:00 p.m. (Details about how to log into the study will be sent out each Wednesday, prior to the meeting.)
- 4. We have, as a service to the community and hospital, increased the frequency of our automated *carillon mini-concerts*. The concerts take place at 10:00, 12:00, 2:00, 4:00 and 6:00 every day. Each concert consists of 4 hymns automatically chosen by the system.
- 5. We are working to *maintain contact* with everyone in the church, with special emphasis on those who are sick, the elderly, and families with children. The contact will be through email, text, video links, and personal visits to those who request them or are in need.



All of our members should have received a letter recently from Pastor Courtney and myself.


The letter was a "thank you" for continuing to support our church financially during this horrible pandemic.

STRENGTHENING OUR SPIRITUAL PRACTICES

How does our faith grow? How do we deepen our faith? This question is especially important right now as we are socially distanced from our sisters and brothers in Christ. It is especially important

right now, when it's so easy to be disconnected from church life. If we're not careful, our faith might stagnate and wither if we do not tend to it. So, how can we grow in our faith during this time of quarantine?

Like other aspects of our lives, our faith is strengthened through practice. An athlete may read and research their sport and watch their peers to gain insight and better understanding, but it is only practice that develops muscle memory, increased speed, better form,



and improved skills. In the same way, our faith is strengthened as we put it into action and practice.

With that in mind, we invite you to explore our new video series, *Practicing Our Faith*. In this series, we will suggest spiritual practices that may be incorporated into everyday life. We hope to share a wide variety of practices – some ancient, some new; some contemplative, some more actionoriented; some easy, some not so easy – because we each come to God in different ways and find meaning and connec-

tion in different approaches.

Each Friday, a new video will be sent out in our daily email, as well as posted on our website, Facebook and YouTube. We encourage you to take the following week

to explore the suggested practice. You may find that some practices work better for you than others. Or you may find that a practice you did not initially find interesting becomes more meaningful to you.

Keep an open heart and an open mind and just have fun and enjoy spending time with God.

Our sincere hope is that this will not be just another item on your to-do list, but rather a fresh opportunity to learn about your faith and to grow ever deeper in your relationship with God.
