HEY FOLKS. I HAVE

served this wonderful church for nearly 18 years now, and many of you have become accustomed to seeing me wandering around the church and this community. I want you to know that the next time you see me, something may be different about my appearance. I am starting to wear a clerical collar. Why?

Good question. Throughout my ministry, I have always felt it is important to be relatable and accessible. I have felt that I should be a person around whom others felt relaxed, and a person who "fit" into many different settings. Therefore, I have chosen not to wear a clerical collar because I did not want to give the appearance that I was "set apart."

While that approach has served me well, and I pray I am still relatable, things have changed. With everything going on in the world today, I now feel that it is important to convey the

fact that I AM set apart. I am first a follower of Jesus, and because of that, I am committed to the teachings of Christ. I am non-violent, I am a peacemaker, and I pray that I can love and compassionately accept people of all colors, genders, and beliefs as those who are desperately loved by a God who is love.

Folks, this world is more divided, and suffering more brokenness, violence, disease and apathy towards Christianity than at any time I can remember. Because of that, I feel called to be easily identifiable as a Christian clergyman. The world proclaims hatred and violence every day on the news; I want to proclaim Christ every day through my words, my actions, and even my clothing.

As I mentioned in a recent sermon, my father was in the habit of going to the same branch of the bank in Atlanta every time he needed to do



some banking. One day, he approached the bank and found the front door locked. An employee saw him standing there looking puzzled, and opened the door to let him in. It turned out that the bank had just been robbed at gunpoint, and the police hadn't even arrived yet. The employees knew my dad, and because of that, they invited him in to pray with the traumatized patrons and employees.



WE WELCOME YOU BACK TO IN-PERSON WORSHIP!

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

It is with joy that we announce the restart of in-person Worship at First Presbyterian Church with precautionary measures in place, beginning September 13. Nursery and childcare for 1st grade and younger will be available. For a while, we will operate at a reduced capacity to ensure worshippers are able to maintain social distancing. We therefore will ask worshippers to make a reservation each week to attend worship in person. You will receive an email on September 2 with instructions for making your reservation online. You can also call the church office at 422-1591 to make your reservation beginning on September 2. Going forward, you will receive an email each Wednesday with a reminder to make your reservation for the following Sunday.

Our Wednesday night activities will begin on September 16. Classes will meet from 5:30 – 6:15 PM. Dinner will be served "to-

go" style at 6:15, beginning on September 23. Please make reservations for dinner as you have in the past.



Children's Church and Sunday School classes, including Rotational Sunday School, will begin on September 27. Rally Day is set for September 20. Youth Connection begins September 27 at 5:00 PM.

Although we are excited to restart in-person Worship and activities at FPC, we recognize that the Covid-19 pandemic is ongoing. Therefore, we will continue to monitor the situation and case numbers in Madison County and will adjust our plans as necessary. We also recognize that each person and family's comfort level is different and we honor the decisions of those who are not yet ready to return in-person. Moreover, we encourage everyone in vulnerable categories to discern prayerfully your best course of action. We will continue to offer Livestream Worship and a Wednesday night Bible study group via Zoom to help all of our families connect in meaningful ways to our faith community. And as always, Pastor John and Pastor Courtney are available in person or via email, phone, or Zoom.

Detailed plans and procedures regarding our safety precautions are available on our website.

We look forward to the day we can all worship together in-person. In the meantime, we are still "the Body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it" (1 Corinthians 12:27). 

WHEN MAKING PURCHASES FOR THE CHURCH

Since FPC has a tax-exempt status, and we have a sales tax exemption number, all persons making purchases for the church should use the tax form and number when making purchases.

As part of our latest audit report, we are not to reimburse anyone for sales tax as part of a receipt/request for payment. You may get a Tax Exempt form upon request from Machelle to use when buying items for the church, which should be provided to the retailer at point of sale.

The church will no longer reimburse for sales tax paid.

session highlight

The Session of First Presbyterian Church, Jackson, TN, met in a virtual meeting on Sunday, August 9, 2020, at 5:00 PM and conducted its normal business.

The Session voted to:

- Approve the minutes of the Stated Session June 14, 2020 and the Called Meeting of June 26, 2020.
- Approve the Playschool opening plan and reopening date of September 8, 2020.
- Ratify the election of the 2020 nominating committee.
- Approve FPC to host the mask distribution in coordination with the local health department on Wednesday, August 12, from 5-7 pm.
- Approve the motion from the Property Committee to replace the Sanctuary roof with cost not to exceed \$25,000 with funds from the Property Trust Money Market Fund.
- Set a Congregational Meeting date for the election of officers on September 28th or 29th by electronic vote.

 Approve the Peacemaking Offering to be received on World Communion Sunday, October 4, 2020, with 75% of funds going to Presbytery and 25% go RIFA.
