from the associate pastor

MANY OF US THINK OF

Lent as a time to give up something we enjoy in order to offer more of our attention and focus to God. This spiritual practice reflects the 40 days that Jesus spent fasting in the wilderness and enduring temptation by Satan. So, we endeavor to emulate Jesus by giving up something that tempts us — perhaps chocolate or excess spending or even social media.

I find the observance of Lent to be a meaningful experience. In 'on demand' society - where we can purchase anything we want with the click of a button, stream endless shows and movies instantly, and the foods we enjoy regardless of season - giving up a luxury can remind us to count our blessings and help us to reexamine our priorities. Lent helps us to remember our complete dependence on God.

Of course, the problem with this year is that we've already

had to give up so much during a pandemic that has disrupted all parts of our lives. The idea of giving another something up is probably not very appealing to many of us. We may even be thinking, "what's left to give up?" And would that practice even be meaningful right now? Or would it be just one more thing among many that we've lost?

But, remember, the purpose of Lent is to help us grow closer to God. And there are plenty of things that come between us and God that we could yield. Consider the habits we have that damage rather than uplift such as gossip and divisive speech. Such actions keep us from building up one another (1 Thessalonians 5:11) and outdoing one another in showing honor (Romans 12:10). Consider also all the negative thoughts and emotions we harbor that separate us from God. Things like anger, distrust, jealousy,



rage, and resentment interfere with our prayer lives, hinder us from reflecting the love and grace of Jesus Christ, and even prevent us from loving God with our whole hearts, souls, and minds. As 1 John 4:20 tells us, "Those who say, "I love God," and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen."



new covid guidelines



A CHANGE IN GATHERING TIMES

We want to make the congregation aware of some new guidelines that will be in place, beginning Sunday, February 14. These guidelines have been unanimously approved by the Session and are based on declines in COVID-related deaths and hospitalizations and on the large number of us who are getting vaccinated.

- 1. The length of our worship services will be returned to 1 hour instead of 45 minutes. (In effect 2-14)
- 2. Our Sunday School time will be returned to 1 hour instead of 45 minutes. (In effect 2-14)
- 3. Our Wednesday Night programming will be returned to 1 hour instead of 45 minutes. (In effect 2-17)
- 4. Following our local school model, our elementary age children will be allowed to take off their masks during class time. The masks will be put back on when going to or from class. Adults, including teachers, will still be asked to wear masks. (*It is our understanding that new mask guidelines apply to "children in the BLAST age group and younger," whenever they are on campus.) (In effect 2-17)

Masking, and all other Covid-19 protocol, will remain the same for Worship services inside the sanctuary.





#### THE SESSION VOTED TO:

The Session of First Presbyterian Church, Jackson, TN, met in a virtual meeting on Sunday, January 10, 2021, at 5:00 PM and conducted its normal business.

#### The Session voted to:

- 1. Approve the minutes of the Stated Session December 13, 2020 and the Called Session meeting of December 21, 2020.
- 2. Adopt the 2021 Challenge Budget.
- 3. Approve a Souper Bowl fundraiser with possible soup "to go" on February 7<sup>th</sup> with proceeds going to RIFA.
- 4. Set a January 24, 2021 date for a Congregational Meeting to vote on both Pastor's Change of Call.

- Begin in person Sunday School on January 24, 2021 with teachers understanding the necessary precautions to be taken and to offer Zoom options if requested.
- 6. Resume "To-Go" meals on Wednesday nights.
- 7. Purchase and install another camera in the santuary and its location to best be determined by the staff with funds donated by an anonymous donor.

#### The Session voted previously by electronic means to:

- 1. Approve the Committee Chair assignments for 2021.
- 2. Approve the hiring of Daniel Redding for Worship Audio/Video Technician (part-time) and that the funding for the position be covered in its entirety by an anonymous donor.
- 3. Approve examination of Mike Taylor and that he be presented on January 10, 2021 to be ordained and installed as an elder at First Presbyterian Church.


