from the associate pastor

LAST SUMMER I WROTE

a newsletter article comparing the Covid pandemic to the "wilderness time" the ancient Israelites experienced as they journeyed from Egypt to the Promised Land. Ours was a time of wandering, confusion and frustration, much like the wilderness days of Moses and his people. Now, as more vaccines are being distributed and precautions are slowly being loosened, we are poised to soon come out of that wilderness. So, it seems a good time to remember and reflect on the Israelites' experience of coming out of the wilderness into a new life. What can their experience teach us? Can it help us be more intentional in our own transition from a wilderness time?

Toward the end of Deuteronomy, while the Israelites are still on the wilderness side of the Jordan River, Moses calls together the congregation. He reminds the people of all that God has done for them: "You have seen all that the Lord did before your eyes in the land of Egypt, to Pharaoh and to all his servants and all his land, the great trials that your eyes saw, the signs, and the great wonders" (29:2-3). They have had a tough journey, but God has seen them through it all. In fact, God is the one who made their journey possible – forcing Pharaoh to release them and pulling back the waters of the Red Sea so the people could cross to safety.

Now Moses proclaims to the Israelites that God will continue to guide and watch over them. He tells them that as they enter Canaan, "it is the Lord who goes before you. He will be with you; he will not fail you or forsake you. Do not fear or be dismayed" (31:8). The people can trust that God will always be with them.

And, finally, it's important to remember that even though the Israelites are exiting the wilderness into "a land flowing with milk and honey," their lives will not be perfect. They will continue to face challenges and battles, such as Jericho, in this new place. However, just as before, God will help the people.



So, what does this mean for us, as we begin to transition from the wilderness? First, let us give thanks for all we have seen "that the Lord did before your eyes" - all the ways God has already guided and shepherded us through our wilderness time. We give thanks for the technology – livestream, Zoom, and even good old fashioned phone calls – that have enabled us to connect when we couldn't **SEE PAGE 2**

And, let us know that although we are emerging from a difficult time and we look forward to a new era, we will still face obstacles and disappointments. We will still have battles to fight. But, let us carry the lessons we learned from our wilderness time with us – that we never journey alone, that God goes before us, leading the way and bringing us to the Promised Land, to the empty tomb, and to resurrection and abundant life.

Thanks be to God. Amen.

Miss G.G. tried to be very reassuring but, I got back in my car and cried because I didn't get Tim into Playschool that day. I called Miss G.G. every month "just to check" if anyone had dropped out. I don't know, but I think, she got tired of me calling and found a space for Tim by the end of October.
