from the pastor

THE UNITED STATES IS, BY

far, the wealthiest nation ever to grace the face of our planet. Yet, reliable polls tell us that most Americans claim to be unhappy much of the time, and our nightly news programs seem to constantly focus on disagreement and discontent. Why? Where has all the joy gone?

Dr. William Lyon Phelps wrote an article long ago in which he said:

"Real joy is not dependent on external things. The pond is fed from within. The kind of joy that stays with us is the joy that springs from inward thoughts and emotions. How essential it is, then, to live inside a mind with attractive and interesting pictures on the walls."

Paul said much the same thing when he directed the Christians at Philippi in this way:

"Summing it all up, friends, I'd

say you'll do best by filling your minds and meditating on things true, noble, reputable, authentic, compelling, gracious - the best, not the worst; the beautiful, not the ugly; things to praise, not things to curse." (Philippians 4:8, Eugene Peterson translation).

According to Jesus, the Kingdom of God is within us, (Luke 17:21), and if we consciously focus our hearts and minds on the good things which spring from that Kingdom, our joy will certainly increase.

On the other hand, if we focus on our failures, or the faults and deficiencies of those around us, our joy will certainly decrease. Surely, we recognize the need to address the negative things of this world, but *our lives must be guided* by the positive nature of God's great love for us, and the gift of God's grace in Jesus Christ. We make a difference in the lives of others when they



recognize God's love in us... We make a difference in the lives of others when they recognize God's love in us.

The content of our mind does impact our state of mind, so try taking Paul's advice. Look for the good in every person and every situation. Build one another up, and live with the grace and peace of Jesus Christ as the guiding force of your life!





This month Miss Penny shares her Playschool is 50 reflections.

I will never forget the first time I pulled through the gate and over the bridge to enter "Wonderland," aka First Presbyterian Church grounds. In 1974, there were woods surrounding the church and it felt so safe and secure. It was beautiful! (and still is).

We had moved to Jackson a few months earlier and were visiting local Kindergartens in the hope of placing our daughter, Stephanie, in one for the fall session. We had visited one other school that morning and we visited no more! We had found our place. As an added blessing we learned that FPC had a Playschool for 3 and 4 year olds so our 3 year old daughter, Elizabeth (Kristi), could go to "school" also. Being a teacher by profession, I was as excited as

the girls were about our new adventure. Little did I know this would be my "home away from home" for the next 38 years! A year and a half later I was hired as the Music Teacher for Kindergarten, and then as the first Playschool

Classroom Teacher with G.G as Director. (Oh, how I loved her!)

Meeting the loving, welcoming teachers that morning-Ms. Pat, Ms. Ann and Ms. G.G., seeing the joyous expressions on the children's faces and feeling the air of anticipation around us touched my heart. I knew that God had led me there. The following years increased my love for Playschool as it grew, changed and yet, stayed the same. I became Director of Playschool when G.G. had to retire. My two Jackson grandchildren also attended Playschool and the love continues to grow with a great granddaughter hoping to

attend the fall of 2022.

Two funny things, out of oh, so many, that happened at Playschool—On the playground, I tied a little boy's shoelaces, patted his sweet little foot and said, "There you go!" He ran about five steps, turned around and said." Where am I going?" Another day we were playing "Follow the Leader" on the front lawn of the Church. The children were following me from tree to tree, running in the sunshine and resting and doing funny motions in the shade. On one of the "runs" I tripped, rolled over and lay sprawled on the grass. Looking up I saw 30+ kids and 2 teachers falling to the ground behind me!

THE SESSION VOTED TO:

The Session of First Presbyterian Church, Jackson, TN, met in a virtual meeting on Sunday, April 11, 2021, at 5:00 PM and conducted its normal business.

The Session voted to:

- Approve the minutes of the Stated Session March 14, 2021.
- Approve the hiring of Shane Powers on a probationary period for 3 months as the Facilities Maintenance Director.
- Approve the revision of the Manuel of Procedure (MOP) for Presbyterian Playschool that outlines the implementation of a new structure of management.
- Approve to the revision of the MOP for the Playschool Director to be in alignment with the revised Presbyterian Playschool MOP.
- Approve a Youth led Bake Sale fundraiser on May 2, 2021 to offset the costs of Montreat Youth Conference.

- Approve construction of a Blessing Box for use by the community, to be placed at the southwest corner of the church's back parking lot.
- Approve the creation of a Butterfly Garden in front of the Playschool playground.
- Approve donations now through the end of May, of gently used or new books for the Team Read program that will benefit children of all ages.
- Appoint Mary Jane McWherter-Chairman, Mona Campbell and Lynn East committee members of the reestablished House Committee to handle furnishings for Memorial Hall.
- To receive a "Love Offering" in honor of Ernie Wilson's retirement to be collected the next 4 weeks.

• To elect Benny Houston to serve as Elder Commissioner to the March 23, 2021 called Presbytery Meeting via Zoom.
