Our 2022 Confirmation Class for our 6th graders has begun. This is a time of deep growth and discernment for our young people - an opportunity to ask questions and learn about the scripture and church tradition that inform and shape our faith.

The curriculum we're using is called "Big God, Big Questions: Confirmation for a Growing Faith" and is structured around the membership questions our students will be asked on Confirmation Sunday - the same

questions we are all asked when we join a Presbyterian church, including our own congregation of FPC.

One of those questions has been weighing on my heart recently. That is, "Will you devote yourself to the church's teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the

prayers?" Each of us has answered that question affirmatively. We've entered into a covenant with God and with the church.

promising to be an active participant in our congregation - learning together, laughing and crying together, sharing Communion together, praying together. We have each made a public profession that

> we will devote ourselves to our shared life of faith here at EPC.

So, how are we doing? If we each, individually, ask ourselves and answer honestly, can we affirm we have devoted ourselves as we said we would? It's a question worth asking our-

selves. A question worth sitting with for a while.

Maybe the answer is yes. There is so much work and



ministry that happens in and around FPC that most of us are not aware of. There are many people reaching out to one another, calling one another, sending cards, praying for each other. There are ministries of service that keep our buildings maintained, that teach thought-provoking classes that invite us to deeper discipleship, that fill our Blessing Box or provide meals to people in our community, that make prayer blankets and other 'Threads of Love,' and so much more.

But maybe the answer is "no." Or maybe the answer is "sometimes" or "every now

and then." Or maybe the answer is "I use to, but now I've fallen away." Whatever the answer is for you, personally, I invite you to ask yourself honestly.

There are so many reasons we may not be devoted right now. Covid, schedule conflicts, being too busy, getting out of the habit of connecting to church while we were socially distancing, our kids wanting to be where their friends are, feeling worn out and stretched too thin, not knowing how to reconnect, etc., etc. Please

believe me when I tell you, I won't pass judgement on any of those. I get it, because I've experienced them too from time to time. So how can we stay connected? Or how can we reconnect? How do we devote ourselves?

I think it starts with remembering God's devotion to us. God loves us so much that the Word became flesh and dwelt among us. God loves us so much that the Word carried a cross and died for us at Calvary. God loves us so much

that even when we feel rejected or ignored God, God never gives up on us. God loves us so much that nothing in life or death can separate us from that love in Christ Jesus. I don't know about

you, but that makes me feel like I can sit through another committee meeting or two. I can prioritize fellowship opportunities with my community of faith, including phone calls, Zoom, or livestream when inperson isn't possible or advisable. I can worship and praise our God!

And when I do those things, when I make those choices

and devote myself to God, I find I am filled beyond measure, that my cup overflows, that I am joyful.

God wants us as a community of faith to be together, to share our faith and witness, to journey with one another, to break bread around a common table, to love and support one another, to pray with each other.

God knows we yearn for connection and is offering it to us. Let us devote ourselves. Amen
