One: We light the first candle.

ALL: The candle of hope.

that God is at work in this world. (the first purple candle is lit)
We light the second candle.

One: We light the second c *ALL*: *The candle of peace*.

One: We light this candle to remind us that God meets us in our fear. Because we need

God's peace when we feel afraid. (the second purple candle is lit)

One: We light the third candle.

ALL: The candle of joy.

One: We light this candle to remind us we can choose a better way. May its light remind

us of the many sources of joy in our lives and may that joy not only draw us closer

to one another, but closer to God. (the third pink candle is lit)

We light the fourth candle.

ALL: The candle of love.

One: We light this candle to remind us that we see God in each other. May we remember

that from the very first generation, God has surrounded us with love.

ALL: Let us walk in the light of the Lord.
